Nigel and I were on a River Cruise holiday: Budapest to Vienna via various places, including Yukovar in Croatia. It is Croatia's largest river port, at the meeting of the Yuka and the Danube rivers. Between Aug and Nov 1991 Under Siege by an invasion of about 36,000 Yugoslav People's army supported by paramilitary forces from Serbia. They were equipped with heavy armour and artillery. Vukovar was defended by around 1,800 lightly armed soldiers and civilian volunteers. During the battle, shells and rockets were fired into the town at a rate of up to 12,000 a day. At the time, it was the fiercest and most protracted battle seen in Europe since 1945, and Vukovar was the first major European town to be entirely destroyed since WW2.

I am not commenting on the politics or the rights and wrongs but noting that 90% of Vs buildings were destroyed and there was much death on both sides. Today, V is a restored town very little remains physically to show that conflict. The church of St Philip and St James was extensively damaged and was completely rebuilt apart from one wall which they allowed to remain in a damaged state as a memorial to that past conflict. Whilst Nigel and I were there, we were speaking to one of the locals – very good English-who was talking about this damaged wall. He something like *we keep it because we must never let our town forget they were and shall ever be our enemies. Never again shall we be friends.*

Now I am all for memorials. We have a particularly marvellous one at the Tilehurst Triangle for remembering those who whose lives were lost in conflict, in war. It is right that we should honour them and mourn them and never forget their sacrifice.

But in the eyes of that local keeping a memorial is so that it perpetuates hatred, so that it perpetuates hostility, so that it perpetuates a continuing animosity, so that it perpetuates an abhorrence of persons.

The phrase that kept repeating itself in my head whilst we were there was this:

IF WE DON'T HEAL THE WOUNDS OF THE PAST, THEY BLEED ALL OVER OUR FUTURE.

Some of us reading this, or listening to this may be finding forgiveness hard.

When our wounds are deep, our sores still running, our hurt overwhelming that is when we need to seek the help of others. If that is you, do speak to your minister and make a plan for moving forward perhaps with professional help and guidance. Remember, IF WE DON'T HEAL THE WOUNDS OF THE PAST, THEY BLEED ALL OVER OUR FUTURE. This is why Jesus tells us about forgiving to 70 times 7.

Reading the Gospel passage I have a picture in my mind of Peter in this story. With a bit of a grin on his face: thinking, I have cracked this one, as he says to Jesus "Lord how many times should I forgive..up to seven times."

At the back of Peter's mind would have been the teaching in the book of Amos. There we see that God's forgiveness extends to three offences but you are punished the 4th time round! So here is Peter expecting his question to be warmly received by Jesus- after all Peter has doubled the three and added an extra one for good measure...7! In Jewish thought 7 is the number of perfection.

Of course, 70 also has a meaning in Scripture. is made up of the factors of two perfect numbers, seven (representing perfection) and ten (representing completeness and God's law). As such, it symbolizes perfect spiritual order.

So, perfect spiritual order and forgiveness go hand in hand.

Our gracious and forgiving God, whose Son Jesus gave up his body to blood-soaked planks of wood and proclaimed from the agony of the nails "Father forgive them", that same God, that same Jesus call us to place our lives where righteousness and peace embrace each other.

May we who have been forgiven much, have ask for the grace to forgive one another. And remember this:

IF WE DON'T HEAL THE WOUNDS OF THE PAST, THEY BLEED ALL OVER OUR FUTURE.

Prayer

Gracious God we come before you and before one another as people in need of forgiveness. We hold before you sins which are too heavy for us to carry. Forgive us what our lips tremble to name and what our hearts can no longer bear. Forgive us too for those times we have held a grudge, those times when we have turned our hearts away from those who have hurt us. We ask you, set us free from a past we cannot change and by your forgiveness open to us a future in which we can be changed more and more into the likeness of Jesus. Thank you that you cover us with pardon and with mercy. For this we are truly thankful. Amen
